



I had the privilege of working with her for 3 ½ years at the Montgomery County Jail ministering to the ladies there every Friday night. They were "her girls" and she loved them enough to tell them the truth about what was going on in their lives and what they needed to do about it. In the prisons, she loved the inmates and they knew it to. She prayed with and for them all; she cried with them during rough times and rejoiced with them during good times. She loved to talk about the prayer warriors housed in jail and in the prisons.

She loved – she loved her church family. It grieved her to her very core when she was unable to attend. She loved all the activities that were happening at her church.
