Dear Hope Partners and Friends,

We have been having good services in the prisons with many coming to the Lord and backsliders returning; the Lord is really moving in the prisons. Many of those who are born again have a real hunger for the Word of God.

Last week, I (Pastor Robert) suffered a bad case of sleep apnea. I was unable to breath. I finally got up, got a glass of water and went outside for air. I saw the doctor last Wednesday and he wanted to put me in the hospital that day but I couldn't go because I am Audrey's caregiver. I will return to see him on Friday, November 8<sup>th</sup>. Audrey was also re-admitted to the hospital 2 weeks ago for a blood clot. They put her on blood thinners which caused her to bleed excessively. She went back to the ER and received vitamin K intravenously and was given a blood transfusion. She did get to come home the next morning. I am currently interviewing CNA's to assist with Audrey's care. We will have to trust God for the financing to pay for it. We remain standing on the promises of God concerning healing and we expect to see the manifestation soon.

A door has opened for us to go into the Unity Baptist Church in Porter on Sunday morning, November 10, to share about the ministry. Please lift us up in prayer as we go.

Enclosed is a flyer about our Christmas Banquet to be held on Saturday, December 7<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 P.M. at the New Covenant Church on Wilson Rd., next to the Humble High School in Humble, Texas.

I want to encourage you to continue to fight the good fight until we meet again here, there or in the air!

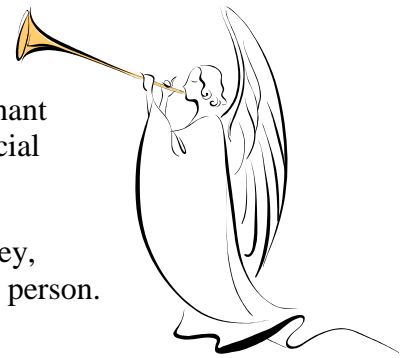

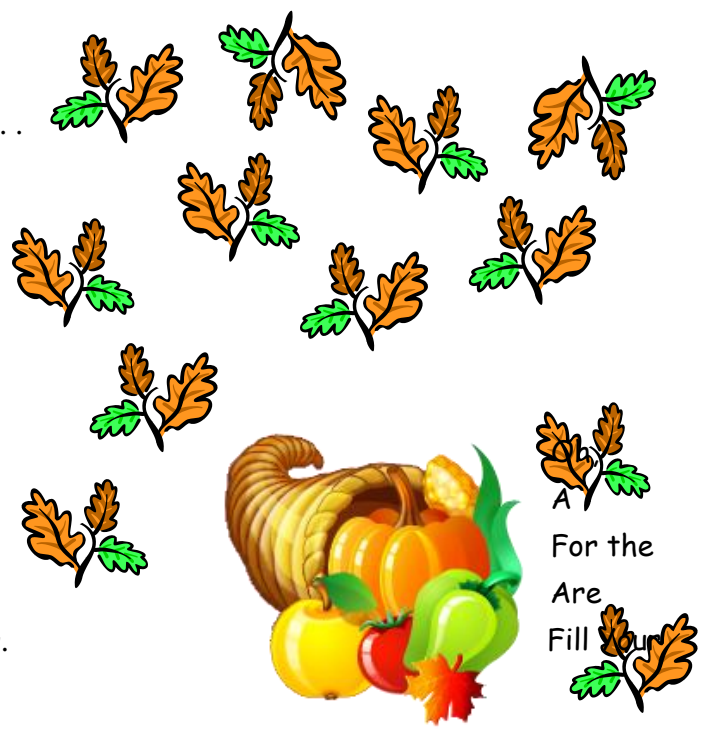
