I have been pleased to see how many friends are anxious to do something about the violence in Dallas. It is really hard to put your finger on how best to help. I offer a few thoughts to you our valued partner in ministry as to ways you might help. Possibly you could select a police officer to befriend. That alone would be a great step forward. If you find yourself in a restaurant where officers are present, you could do as I have done and purchase their meal as an expression of your gratitude for their service. At the least, you might consider introducing yourself to an officer and verbally thanking him or her for sacrificially providing an often thankless service. However, if you could do both that would be great!

At a time when the racial divide has never been more apparent, perhaps building a bridge between the various races is even more important. As believers we have so much in common, skin color shouldn't even be a consideration. You may be asking how we can transcend this racial divide. A good start might be to build a bridge of honesty. As we begin to recognize and celebrate the many things we share in common, racial differences should not even enter into our conversation. In fact, we must admit that allowing such a divisive focus on race is sinful.

Think of the potential impact of a blessing shared with a policeman or with someone of a different race by the 40,000 plus partners of our ministry. Who knows? It just might be the first step of progress in solving the great problems facing our country and society.
