When asked to write a paragraph or two for this newsletter, I must admit, I laughed a little inside because being a Baptist preacher, I know very few that are capable of just a "few" words. When asked, a specific thought came into memory that isn't new but it is proven for me: <u>K-I-S-S</u>, "Keep It Simple Stupid". It's an old acrostic I learned years ago and maybe some of you too have heard it. But, it has really kept me focused on what's important in life and to my surprise; I have found it is a biblical principle that is repeated many times throughout scripture in one way or another. We no doubt have all heard or seen those signs at sporting events that read John 3:16? This verse is powerful and if it's all we had from God's Word it would definitely be enough to save all of mankind. But, in a time when many are seeking day to day answers that seem never to come from a God they feel they can't know and a God who is challenged by definition, description and even His office; it is in these times that I refer back to KISS. Notice how David describes it in...

Psalm 17: 6-15 "I have called upon thee, for thou wilt hear me, O God: incline thine ear unto me, and hear my speech.⁷ Shew thy marvellous lovingkindness, O thou that savest by thy right hand them which put their trust in thee from those that rise up against them. ⁸ Keep me as the apple of the eye, hide me under the shadow of thy wings, ⁹ From the wicked that oppress me, from my deadly enemies, who compass me about. ¹⁰ They are inclosed in their own fat: with their mouth they speak proudly. ¹¹ They have now compassed us in our steps: they have set their eyes bowing down to the earth; ¹² Like as a lion that is greedy of his prey, and as it were a young lion lurking in secret places. ¹³ Arise, O LORD, disappoint him, cast him down: deliver my soul from the wicked, which is thy sword: ¹⁴ From men which are thy hand, O LORD, from men of the world, which have their portion in this life, and whose belly thou fillest with thy hid treasure: they are full of children, and leave the rest of their substance to their babes. ¹⁵ As for me, I will behold thy face in righteousness: I shall be satisfied, when I awake, with thy likeness."

The setting: These verses are unique because David, though having been anointed King of Israel, was dealing at the present, with a very real danger in the person of the current King of Israel, Saul. Saul was desperately trying to kill him while holding on to the throne that God had stripped from him due to his sins. For David, and for us, this is as real as it gets: death, because no problem compares to death; it is that final blow of every life here on this earth before the judgment of God we all stand; no matter who we are, what our stories are and the many trials and persecutions of life we endure: know of a certainty that we will all stand and be judged by God Himself. In that instant, we will all have wished to have lived a better life for Christ. But, today, maybe this will help you do just that and, for me, it is made easier when I remember: K-I-S-S.

A simple life or a simple service is a myth; these are terms used by people who never get out of bed or are born with a silver spoon in their mouths so the reality is, there simply is no simple service for God and there is no simple life I've ever seen. The truth is, we spend most of our energy striving to "Keep" ourselves together and many times it seems an impossibility because life happens, at an amazing clip at times and before we know it, we are there, right in that place we hoped to never be found. We all know it as that place where our greatest fears grip us. It is for us all, our very own personal hell; where thoughts assail and the devil plays havoc with our hearts and emotions. The "IT" of this acrostic is the many details of life we have no control over at times and the ones the devil uses to embattle our very life. Simple as described above is utterly impossible. But, if you are like me, I really relate to the "Stupid"! For me, and I'm sure for us all; we've done things we can never undo and things we wished we'd never been a part of. No matter how hard our exterior shell or reputation may be, we all desire to be loved. We all need a place of refuge and we all need the reality of someone who genuinely cares. When I ponder my errors of life, I have found, every single time that they occur outside the wings of the God of Psalm 17. I have found that when I'm in my stupid phases of my life, God hasn't abandoned me like every one else has or even as I perceive Him to have done. When I simply run back to the provision of His Word, and by faith embrace His teaching, I find that there He stands, affixed; and, just as an eagle spreads her wings to comfort her young, He, in like manner covers us with that embrace we all desire, whether we admit or not. That promise David begged for in Psalm 17, is a promise that all people who claim Jesus as Lord have a right to pursue. When life is hard, problems insurmountable, there is a place to run. It's under the shadow of His wings. You'll find that He's there, waiting for you. And, as David prayed, Lord, keep me as the apple of the eye, we too should pray. If we try we will see another K-I-S-S found in Psalm 2: 12 "Kiss the Son, lest he be angry, and ye perish from the way, when his wrath is kindled but a little. Blessed are all they that put their trust in him." When life is so dark and vast, there in the distance is our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; waiting, longing to show us how much He cares.
