Our dear sister has an oversize load of tasks at this time and has asked me to write up the greeting for this month, the end of which people all over this nation will celebrate everything from Halloween, (which I don't care to comment on), to All Saints Day, including Harvest celebrations. Most of these celebrations are conducted in Churches, Municipal buildings, Schools, etc. for the sake of the safety of our children, since certain Halloween celebrations are dangerous for the innocent. All saint's day as celebrated by the Roman Catholic, and some Protestant Churches is a remembering of saints of old and saints of the present who have given their lives to serving God's Kingdom and God's purpose. And as such, I would like to honor the many saints who continue in dedication to doing good for the relief of the poor and the suffering, and the saints who daily spend time and resources in obedience to the call of our Savior, Jesus Christ.



Among those saints we honor this month is:

Evangelist John Wayne Earl, born November 23rd, 1944, and who passed through the veil into the arms of Abraham, September 23rd, 2021. Brother John is survived by his lovely wife, Maxine, (whom you may remember was healed of cancer), his daughter Aaliyah and his son John Jr. Our

I like to say of John, he has the gentlest spirit of any person I have ever known.

John was the author of <u>The Breadbox</u> Newsletter, a book, <u>The Adventures of Randy</u>, two music CD's and a DVD.

John Earl was a highly valued member of the <u>Hope for All in Jesus Prison</u>

<u>Outreach</u> and went with teams into the prisons with music and preaching. I'm sure the inmates will also miss him as we do.

Evangelist John Earl is a perfect example of why we go into the prisons. While serving back to back sentences at Clemens prison, John gave his heart to Jesus and the transformation was glorious. Then, while serving God from within the walls, his sentence was commuted, and John continued to serve

The Lord from outside the walls, going in to minister. There are more John Earls behind bars and we aim to reach them with the Good News of Jesus.

We also honor: Brother Robert Dubois, founder of <u>Hope For All in Jesus Prison</u> <u>Outreach</u> Who parted from this world last year, July 23rd, 2020, and we dearly miss him.

CLEMENS UNIT: Sunday, September 5th, My husband, Leonard, and I had the privilege of ministering to the men at the trustee camp at Clemens Unit on Sunday, September 5, 2021. The Lord had given me the message to share a couple of weeks before, "Find Your Rest in the Lord". I did not realize until that Saturday that the message went perfectly with Labor Day Weekend.

"Come unto me, all you that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." Matthew 11:28

I shared that God says He is their Sabbath, and that they can have rest in Him. Then as the Holy Spirit led me off my prepared script, I shared with them that some of them had been "sleeping" with one eye open and one eye closed. Later on, after the service, several of the men shared with us that they had quite a few new men who had been added to the trustee camp, and that they were "youngsters". For this reason, many of the more seasoned trustees HAD been having trouble sleeping. They left believing that later that evening they WOULD have peaceful sleep and would be able to rest. God knew what they needed. All GLORY to HIS NAME!

Pastor Leonard came up and gave the men encouraging words, a few good stories, and some deep belly laughs (as he usually does). They said they really needed that!

We shared with them about John Earl's health battle. He was still in the hospital at that time. We now know that he is safely resting in the arms of his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. If I have ever known a man in love with the Lord, it was John Earl. He will be greatly missed!

The church prayed for John Earl, and we worshipped with his music on CD with the men. We told them that John Earl had been right there at Clemens where they are now, and about how Jesus changed his life. John Earl was actually ministering at Clemens that day, from his hospital bed, through his music and his testimony. What a blessing he has been to so many!

Quite a few men came up for prayer at the end of the service. The praise and worship team blessed us all, and we left, thankful again, to be able to be so blessed, while bringing a blessing to the men at Clemens Unit in Brazoria. All of the GLORY goes to God.

RAMSEY UNIT: Saturday, September 26th, 2021 Chaplain Shelia Johnson and Apostle Ray Felder went to the Ramsey Unit in Rosharon, TX. The choir opened up with three songs. I ministered two songs and Apostle Ray Felder ministered with a message from Romans 12 "Let love be without dissimulation". Several men came up for prayer.

ESTELLE UNIT, HUNTSVILLE: Sunday, September 26th

I went into this unit alone, because the Hope For All In Jesus Ministry is short of volunteers. I ministered in 4 services; 2 in the morning and 2 in the afternoon. This unit still has restrictions because of the virus which limits the number allowed in each service to 25 and there was no worship team. Not all units still have these restrictions and was told they expect them to be lifted next week. My morning services were held in the gym



while another service was being held in the Chapel by another prison ministry and in the afternoon, I

ministered services in the Chapel. This is being done to accommodate as many inmates as possible. The worship team was not allowed in these services at this time but one of the men led worship on a keyboard. I brought my guitar and sang God Will Make A Way by Don Moen and Friend of God by Israel Houghton before giving messages on 2 Corinthians 10:3-5 concerning the weapons that we have to demolish strongholds and John Chapter 17 when Jesus prays for His followers. Although I was in this unit for over 8 hours it did not seem that long because of the enthusiasm of the men as they received the messages.




PRAY FOR OUR NATION


